#### ACT NO.2 OF 1989

31 St July , 1989.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE A SUM OF THREE THOUSAND AND TWENTY FOUR MILLION AND TWO HUNDRED FORTY SIX THOUSAND SHILLINGS OUT OF THE CONSOLIDATED FUND TO THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING ON THE THIRTIETH DAY OF JUNE, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINETY, TO AUTHORISE THE RE-ALLOCATION OF CERTAIN APPROPRIATIONS AND TO PROVIDE FOR MATTERS INCIDENTAL THERETO AND CONNECTED THEREWITH.

ENACTED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF ZANZIBAR.

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1989.

Issue of shillings 3,024,246,000 out of the Consolidated Fund. 2. The Treasury, Ministry of Finance - Zanzibar, may issue out of the Consolidated Fund of the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, 1990 the sum of Three Thousand Twenty Four Thousand Million Two Hundred Forty Six Thousand Shillings.

Appropriation of moneys voted.

3. The sum granted by section 2 of this Act shall be applied for the purposes and amounts specified in the Schedules of this Act.

Power of Minister to borrow.

- 4.(1) The Minister for Finance may at any time not later than the thirtieth day of June, 1990 borrow within or outside Zanzibar, any sum or sums not exceeding the total sum granted or deemed to have been granted out of the Consolidated Fund under the provisions of section 2 of this Act by way of Loan; advance the issue of bills or bank overdraft, and on such terms, and conditions as the Minister may deem expedient, and may charge that loan or advance on any of the assets of Zanzibar (including securities forming part of the Consolidated Fund).
- (2) Any money borrowed under this section, shall be placed to the credit of the Exchequer Account and shall form part of the Consolidated Fund, and be available in any manner in which that fund is available.
- (3) Any money borrowed under this section shall be subject to repayment not later than the thirtieth day of June, 1990 and any sum required for the payment of any money so borrowed, and of any interest payable in respect of that money shall be charged on and paid out of the Consolidated Fund.
- (4) The powers conferred upon the Minister for Finance Zanzibar, under this section shall be in addition to the powers of the Minister under the Government Loans, Stocks and Grants Guarantee Decree 1978.

Decree No.5 of 1978.

Powers of the Minister to reallocate certain appropriate moneys.

5.(1) where the Minister for Finance Zanzibar is satisfied that it is necessary in the public interest that provision should be made for defraying the expenditure of any Ministry or Department of the Government in excess of any sum voted, for it or for any service for which no sum is voted, and that it would be detrimental to the public interest to postpone

the expenditure until provision can be made for it by the House of Representatives, he may notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in this Act, or any other written law, authorise the application of any surplus arising on any vote in the Schedule to this Act, for or towards the excess or service.

- (2) Where the Minister for Finance authorizes the application of any surplus under this section, he shall as soon as practicable after authorization cause to be laid before the House of Representatives a supplementary estimate for a statement of reallocation as the case may be in accordance with the provisions of section 105(2) of the Zanzibar Constitution, 1984 if such re-allocation results in a surplus expenditure.
- (3) The Minister for Finance may delegate all or any of the powers conferred upon him by this section to any public officer subject to such limitations as the Minister may specify.

Redemptions and payment of interests.

6. The sum required from time to time for Public Loans Redemptions and the repayments of interests ranging from 7% - 15 per cent in respect of inscribed of Zanziber Stocks 1993-94/2000 (Shs.448,681,931) and hereby charged upon shall be paid out of the Consolidated Fund.

Approval of Development Plans.

7. The Development Plans indicated in Schedule II are hereby approved for the year 1989/90.

Approval of moneys voted and or granted for development expenditure. 8. The sum granted in accordance with this section for development expenditure and as indicated in Schedule III thereof shall be applied for purposes and amounts specified in Schedule IV to this Act.
